1. What is one event in your life that you never want to forget? What do you use as a reminder?
2. Has there ever been a time in your life when you kept a journal or diary? How has that benefited your life?
3. Read Hebrews 4:12. How is the Word of God alive? How has it exposed your heart?
4. Read 2 Timothy 3:16. When have you seen this truth lived out in your own life?
5. What approach have you taken in your Bible reading this year, and how has it significantly impacted your spiritual life?
6. Have someone read Philippians 2:1–2 and Ecclesiastes 4:12. How have you seen these ideas lived out in your small group?
7. How have you personally benefited from being in your small group this year?
8. Read Matthew 5:14–16 and 1 Timothy 6:18–19. What kind of impact are we called to have in this world? What are the results of such living?
9. What are some specific ways that you have served others this past year?
10. In which area do you hope to see the most growth in the next year: learning, relating, or serving? Why?
11. How can your small group help you to achieve these goals?
12. Pray together, thanking God for what He has done in you and through you this year.
